Minutes of June 9, 2008
LAFAYETTE LEARNING CENTER

The regular business meeting of the Board of Education of the Morris School District, of Morris County, New Jersey was held in the 2nd floor conference room of the Lafayette Learning Center, 31 Hazel Street, Morristown, New Jersey 07960 on **Monday evening June 9, 2008 at 6:30 p.m.**

William VanTassel, the Assistant Board Secretary, called the meeting to order and made the following announcement: The New Jersey Open Public Meeting Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interest is discussed or acted upon. In accordance with the provisions of this Act the Board of Education of the Morris School District in the County of Morris has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted. The notice was mailed to the Daily Record, the Star Ledger, and to those persons or entities requesting notification, filed with the municipal clerks of Morris Plains, Morristown and Morris Township, and posted at the Administration Center, 31 Hazel Street, Morristown, New Jersey.

At the Roll Call, the following Board Members were present: Mrs. Marie Fornaro, Dr. Peter Gallerstein, Ms. Lynn Horowitz, Mrs. Teresa Murphy, Dr. Angela Rieck, Ms. Lisa Pollak, Vice-President, Mrs. Nancy Bangiola, President. Mrs. Ann Rhines arrived at 6:40 p.m. Ms. Theresa Kaag, Morris Plains Representative arrived at 7:30 p.m. Ms. Sandra McNeil was absent.

At 6:30 p.m. Mrs. Bangiola moved to go into closed session to discuss legal, negotiation and personnel matters. Dr. Rieck seconded the motion which carried unanimously with Mrs. Rhines, Ms. Kaag and Mrs. McNeil absent.

Also present in closed session were Dr. Thomas Ficarra, Superintendent; Dr. Patricia Camp, Director of Curriculum and Instruction; Mr. Andrew Williams, Director of Curriculum and Instruction; Mr. John Christian, Manager of Human Resources; Mr. William VanTassel, Assistant Board Secretary and Mr. James McCreedy of Wiley, Malehorn, Sirota and Raynes. Mrs. Susan Young, the Board Secretary, did not attend closed session.

At 7:30 p.m. Dr. Rieck moved to go into open session. Ms. Horowitz seconded the motion which carried unanimously with Ms. Kaag and Ms. McNeil absent. Approximately 7 members of the public, press and staff were now present.

When the Board reconvened, Mrs. Bangiola announced that the Board had been meeting in closed session for the purpose of discussing legal, negotiation and personnel matters.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mrs. Bangiola led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT

A member of the public spoke on behalf of her son. He is a disabled student whose aid, who does not have seniority, is being rifted due to budgetary cuts. He will get a new aid, however, he has a good working relationship with this aid and wants the board to make an exception to the seniority rule and allow him to keep her.

The board urged the mother to work with Mrs. Helterman, the director of Pupil Service, as well as the high school in resolving this matter.

EXTRARODINARY AID AUDIT

Mrs. Helterman reported that the district had been audited on extraordinary aid. (A copy of the audit is attached.)

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Ficarra reported on:

- TEAM Settlement –
 - First Year 4.69 %
 - Second Year 4.52 %
 - Third Year 4.5 %

As part of the agreement the district will be changing health care providers. The district will now be enrolled in the State Health Benefit Program.

A savings of 1 million dollars will be realized in the first 6 months.

Traditional Health Plan Benefit, which is the most expensive, will be removed permanently.

District costs will be reduced by \$200,000/month.

The Saturday May 30, 2008 meeting was held to meet the 60 day requirement for enrollment into the health benefit plan.

Ms. Horowitz commented that the health care savings made this a fiscally responsible decision.

\$1,384	FRE	Team Building Literacy Initiative In an effort to infuse the importance of strong literacy skills across the curriculum, the teachers will purchase student periodicals specific to content areas including Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, and Science. As a result, students will be able to keep themselves apprised of current events and research specific to all facets of their curriculum.

- \$555 AH **Graphic Novels Rule!**
Graphic novels appeal to students, especially boys, and reluctant readers. These novels present important personal and social issues in a kid friendly, comic book format. This grant allows the library media center to purchase this type of novel. There is a writing component and an art component with this grant. Classroom teachers and the art specialist will enrich the reading of these books.
- \$1,020 MHS **WebAssign**
WebAssign is an online homework, quiz, and test service that will be used to enhance instruction of physics at the high school. This system is an internet based technology that is used in many colleges and universities as well. This would be an excellent way of familiarizing students with this technology as well as being an effective tool for our physics students.

Educational program development proceeds according to the District's first principles of program development; i.e., research-oriented inquiry, collaborative work, consensus building, opportunities for dialogue.

Motion #12 that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, the Board of Education accept \$1,008.96 for Fiscal 2005, Section 8003, from the Impact Aid of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act.

EXPLANATION:

The Morris School District is eligible for Impact Aid because of the presence of certain federally owned or subsidized facilities in our areas. The basis for this is that either the facilities reduce the total taxable property in the district or impact the schools with children of government employees. The specific properties identified for Impact Aid eligibility include the National Historic Park, the Army Reserve Center, the FAA facility at Morristown Airport, and the Housing Authority Property. The latter is the most significant factor in our eligibility.

Motion #13 that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent and the Board Curriculum Committee, the Board of Education approve submission of the Staples Foundation for Learning Grant in the amount of \$25,000. The application's deadline is June 16, 2008.

EXPLANATION:

This grant would be used to purchase equipment (copier, computer, binding machine, etc.) to set up a business services training center at the high school as part of the Career Academy program serving general and special education students.

Funds will be used to offset costs of four inclusive preschool classrooms at the Lafayette Learning Center as well as program enhancements at the Head Start of Morris County and Children on the Green during the 2008-2009 school year.

EXPLANATION:

We have used the ELLI Grant awarded for the past four years to offset costs of running our inclusive preschool classrooms. If renewed, approximately \$102,300 of the money would enable us to continue to offset local funding costs. If fully funded and enrolled, approximately \$132,000 of the grant total would be used to enhance program standards for our future Morris School District kindergartners at the local community providers listed above.
